All participants will receive a certificate of participation for the workshop. This can be provided to your professional association for education credits. If you require any further documentation, please contact the Ethics Program.

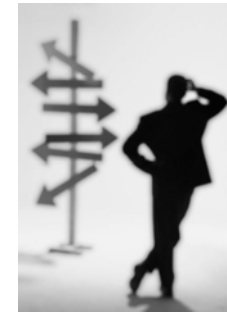
