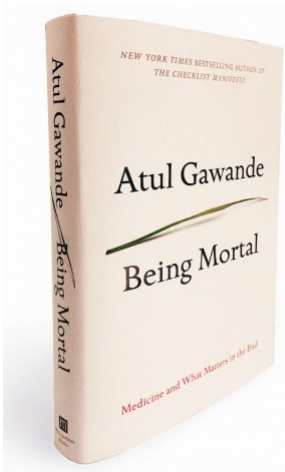


Bioethics Book Club: Being Mortal
